SHORT TITLE. This ordinance may be cited as the "Early Head Start Program Governance 8 9 Act". 10 Section 2. FINDINGS. 11 The City of Albuquerque has a long term grant from the U.S. (A) [Bracketed/Strikethrough Material] - Deletion Department of Health and Human Services that provides funds for the Early 12 Bracketed/Underscored Material] - New Head Start Program (Program); 13 14 The Program is an innovative early intervention program that (B) provides a range of comprehensive services to promote optimal child 15 16 development; 17 The Council finds that good governance for the Program is critical to (C) maintaining valuable program services, as well as being critical to adhering to 18 U.S Department of Health and Human Services regulatory requirements; 19 20 The Council finds that governance over the range of activities is (D) 21 complex and good governance needs to provide regular and frequent 22 direction and oversight; 23 The Council finds that the Program would be best served by an Early (E) Head Start Program Governance Advisory Committee (Committee) that will 24 fulfill a range of federally-mandated governance functions. The City Council 25 shall maintain its general governing authority, as well as its legal and fiscal 26

- 1 Program attendance. The actual presence and participation in the program of a child enrolled in an Early Head Start or Head Start program. 2 Secretary. EARLY HEAD START PROGRAM GOVERNANCE ADVISORY 7 8 COMMITTEE CREATED - MEMBERSHIP 9 The "Early Head Start Program Governance Advisory Committee" is (A) created. The Committee shall consist of seven (7) members appointed by the 10 11 Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council. (1) One member must have fiscal/accounting background and expertise. 12 (2) One member must have early childhood education and development 13 14 background. 15 (3) One member must be a licensed attorney. (4) The remaining members must reflect the community served and 16 include parents of children who are, or were formerly, enrolled in Head Start 17 18 Programs. 19 (B) Members shall serve three (3) year terms. However, of the Committee members first named upon committee formation, three members 20 21 will have terms ending July 1, 2014, two members will have terms ending July 1, 2015 and two will have terms ending July 2016. - (3) The total number of children and families served, the average monthly enrollment (as a percentage of funded enrollment) and the percentage of eligible children served;
- (4) The results of the most recent review by the Secretary and the financial audit:
- (5) The percentage of enrolled children that received medical and dental exams:
- (6) Information about family engagement activities; 31
- 32 (7) The efforts of the Program to prepare children for kindergarten; and,
- (8) Any other information that is required by the Secretary. 33



SUBJECT: Ordinance Adopting an Early Head Start Program Governance

The Department of Family and Community Services, Office of Child Development, Division of Early Head Start requests the establishment of an *Ordinance Adopting an Early Head Start Program Governance* through creation of a sub-governing board by the City Council. The establishment of this sub-governing body is consistent and allowable under federal Early Start guidelines. This sub-committee will enable the City of Albuquerque Early Start program to address program governance issues found in the 2013 federal review. Attached is the draft language which is recommended for approval and meets the criteria for statue and provides administrative policies for the selection of members.

This action does not remove administrative authority from the City of Albuquerque and has been drafted, reviewed and approved by the City of Albuquerque legal department. Additionally, the draft language has been approved by the Administration for Children and Families Office of Head Start.

This ordinance is forwarded to the Council for consideration and action.

Cover Analysis

- 1. **What is it?** Ordinance Adopting an Early Head Start Program Governance. The attached City of Albuquerque City Council statue will establish a sub governing body to administer the federal Administration for Children and Families Office of Head Start Early Head Start Grant.
- 2. What will this piece of legislation do? Establish a sub governing body to administer and provide oversight to the federal Administration for Children and Families Office of Head Start Early Head Start Grant. Set administrative guidelines and process for selection of governing body membership in accordance with federal guidelines and allowable by federal regulations.
- **3.** Why is the project needed? Statue is needed to create a sub governing body to administer the federal Early Head Start Grant and address compliance issues efficiently.
- **4.** How much will it cost and what is the funding source. There is no fiscal impact.
- 5. Is there a revenue source associated with this contract? If so, what level of income is projected? For year 2013-2014 funding level is \$2,661,617.
- **6. What will happen if this project is not approved?** The City of Albuquerque Early Head Start program funding may be jeopardized given recent audit findings for program governance.
- 7. Is this service already provided by another entity? No, the City of Albuquerque administers the Early Head Start program for 208 program participants based upon federal eligibility guidelines.
