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1 participants are able to hear each other at the same time and members of the  
2 public attending the meeting are able to hear any member of the Council who  
3 speaks during the meeting.

4 (C) The Council shall comply with all applicable policies, ordinances,  
5 resolutions, rules and regulations of the city.”

6 SECTION 3. § 2-6-5-5 DUTIES, RESPONSIBILITIES AND POWERS is  
7 hereby amended as follows:

8 “The mission of the ABQ ADA Advisory Council is to support the civil rights  
9 of, and full integration into, Albuquerque community life for all people with  
10 disabilities. The ABQ ADA Advisory Council shall:

11 (A) Advise the Mayor and City Council on issues affecting people with  
12 disabilities.

13 (B) Provide a public forum to identify, discuss, and address issues relevant  
14 to people with disabilities.

15 (C) Report on accessibility problems around the city.

16 (D) Provide information to the city's ADA Coordinator about disability  
17 concerns expressed by the public.

18 (E) Provide information, educational opportunities and networking  
19 opportunities to all citizens with disabilities.

20 (F) Establish criteria for prioritizing the remedial steps to address access  
21 needs within the community.

22 (G) Develop operating procedures for the ABQ ADA Council.

23 (H) Review city government program services and activity access for  
24 physical, sensory, or other impediments.

25 (I) Review city codes with the city's Office of Diversity & Human Rights  
26 relating to disability rights and access.

27 (J) Make recommendations to the Mayor and City Council regarding a  
28 community transition plan that addresses: barriers (non-structural) to city  
29 programs, services and activities and barriers (structural) to city facilities  
30 including parks and trails.

31 (K) Create an Advisory Committee comprised of at least 3 developmentally  
32 disabled citizens, and/or their advocates, to provide input to the ABQ ADA  
33 Council to ensure their issues are being addressed.”

1 SECTION 4. § 2-6-5-6 TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE is hereby  
2 amended as follows:

3 "The ABQ ADA Council will receive effective and ongoing training and  
4 technical assistance from the city's Office of Diversity and Human Rights to  
5 ensure that they understand the information they receive and are able to  
6 provide effective oversight of and make appropriate decisions regarding the  
7 City of Albuquerque's compliance with Title II of the Americans with  
8 Disabilities Act of 1990."

9 SECTION 5. COMPILATION. This Ordinance shall be incorporated in and  
10 made part of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque, New Mexico, 1994.

11 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect five days  
12 after publication by title and general summary.

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

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
