O-17-60 **SPONSORED BY: Patrick Davis** 1 **ORDINANCE** 2 **ENACTING THE ALBUQUERQUE "SECURITY ASSISTANCE FUNDING** 3 DISTRICT ORDINANCE:" PROVIDING FOR THE DESIGNATION OF SECURITY 4 ASSISTANCE FUNDING (SAF) DISTRICTS UPON APPLICATION TO THE CITY 5 BY A CERTAIN NUMBER OF MERCHANTS OR REAL PROPERTY OWNERS IN 6 THE PROPOSED DISTRICT; REQUIRING THE CREATION OF A SECURITY 7 PLAN FOR THE DESIGNATED DISTRICT; PROVIDING FOR CITY MATCHING 8 **GRANTS TO HELP DEFRAY THE COST OF SECURITY IMPROVEMENTS** 9 DESCRIBED IN A DISTRICT'S SECURITY PLAN. 10 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF 11 **ALBUQUERQUE:** [Bracketed/Strikethrough Material] - Deletion 12 SECTION 1. A new Article 22 is added to Chapter 9 "Health, Safety and Bracketed/Underscored Material] - New 13 Sanitation" of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque, 1994, titled "Security 14 Assistance Funding Districts," reading as follows: 15 **"§9-22-1** SECURITY ASSISTANCE FUNDING DISTRICTS. The City 16 Council may designate by resolution certain areas of the City as Security 17 Assistance Funding (SAF) Districts, for which the provisions of this Section 18 shall apply. In making such a designation, the Council must find that the area 19 meets the following conditions: 20 1. The area is a commercial or arts and cultural district with significant 21 economic development, art or cultural impact, tourist-related facilities 22 and attractions or tourist-related transportation systems, or is of other 23 significant importance to the city. The area cannot be primarily 24 residential in nature. 25 2. The area is compact and contiguous enough to be identifiable as a 26 distinct area of the City, and must be listed with specificity by blocks

and map.

- 3. The City Council has received an application requesting the designation of a SAF District from ten or more business owners comprising at least fifty-one percent of the total business owners in the proposed District or from five or more real property owners comprising at least fifty-one percent of the total real property owners in the proposed District, exclusive of any real property owned by the United States or the state or any of its political subdivisions. Prior to submission to the City, the applicant shall work with City staff, including staff from APD, DMD, DFAS and Council Services, to jointly develop a proposed security plan for the area. The application shall:
  - (a) state the purpose for the creation of the District;
  - (b) describe in general terms the real property to be included in the District;
  - (c) include a security plan developed in conjunction with City staff, that addresses specific public safety issues within the area, including specific criminal offenses that are prevalent in the area. The security plan must be specific to the area and backed up with verifiable data.
- 4. The designation as an SAF District is valid for one year and the Council must reconsider and readopt these findings on an annual basis in order for the area to maintain the SAF District designation.
- §9-22-2 GRANTS FOR DESIGNATED PUBLIC SAFETY DISTRICTS.

  Subject to appropriation and the availability of funds, upon designation or redesignation as a SAF District, the area is eligible for matching grants from the City to assist in the implementation of the security plan described in subparagraph 3(c) above. City grants will be subject to the following conditions:
  - 1. grants for any designated SAF District may not exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in any fiscal year;
  - 2. grants will require a 1:1 cash match from the merchants and/or property owners in the area. In other words, every dollar of City grant must be matched by a dollar from the merchants or property owners in the area;
  - 3. grants may be used to pay for components described in the security plan for the area including, but not limited to, private security,

- surveillance cameras, street and pedestrian lighting, alarm systems, signage related to public safety, barriers, fencing, gates and chief's overtime;
  - 4. The applicant must provide a board to administer the grant. The board may be either a local business association, a local mainstreet program, or a non-profit entity;
  - 5. At the end of each fiscal year, the grantee, as designated by resolution, shall provide the City with a report consisting of a complete accounting of all expenditures relating to the security plan for the area, and data describing progress, if any, towards reducing the specific public safety issues that led to the designation of the area as a SAF District."

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this ordinance. The Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase thereof irrespective of any provision being declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.

SECTION 3. COMPILATION. The ordinance shall be incorporated in and made part of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque, New Mexico, 1994.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect five days after publication by title and general summary.
