FINDINGS AND INTENT.** 8 (A) The City Council finds that that the ART, scheduled to be operational by 9 the end of calendar year 2017, has passenger boarding, fare collection, traffic 10 lane usage and other structural and operational features which require 11 amendments to existing Ordinances to operate ART while maintaining public - Deletion Bracketed/Underscored Material] - New 12 safety. 13 (B) The City Council finds that these ART and general transit ordinance Bracketed/Strikethrough Material] 14 amendments will help promote the health, safety, and welfare of the 15 community by providing guidelines for the operation of ART. 16 (C) The intent of these amendments is to enact ordinances to be enforced 17 consistent with the stated purposes in this Section 1. 18 SECTION 2. CHAPTER 7, ARTICLE 2, PART 1, IS HEREBY AMENDED AS 19 **FOLLOWS:** 20 **"§ 7-2-1-2 VIOLATION.** 21 It shall be a violation of § 7-2-1-1 for any person using the transit system to 22 fail to pay the applicable fare. Any person in violation of § 7-2-1-1 is guilty of a 23 misdemeanor and subject to the penalty provisions set forth in § 1-1-99 ROA 1994." 24 25 SECTION 3. CHAPTER 7, ARTICLE 2, PART 2, IS HEREBY AMENDED AS 26 **FOLLOWS:**

SUBJECT: Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque Relating to the Albuquerque Rapid

Transit Program and the Operation and Use of Transit Vehicles and

Facilities

The attached Ordinance for City Council consideration, if enacted, would provide for a greater level of security and healthier environment for users of public transit. This Ordinance amends current City Code and enacts additions to City Code related to:

- A. The maximum penalty for failure to pay the applicable transit fare, and
- B. The use of Albuquerque Rapid Transit stations during operating and non-operating hours, and
- C. Designating non-smoking areas for transit boarding areas, facilities, and vehicles, and
- D. Mayor's ability to designate individuals to enforce the Albuquerque Clean Indoor Air Ordinance.

This Ordinance is being forwarded to the City Council for approval.

Cover Analysis

1. What is it?

This Ordinance provides amendments and additions to City Code to promote the health, safety, and welfare of the use of the Albuquerque Rapid Transit system (ART).

2. What will this piece of legislation do?

This Ordinance amends current City Code and enacts additions to City Code related to:

- A. The maximum penalty for failure to pay applicable fare
- B. The use of ART stations during operating and non-operating hours.
- C. Designating no smoking areas for transit boarding areas, facilities, and vehicles
- D. Mayor's ability to designate individuals to enforce the Albuquerque Clean Indoor Air Ordinance

3. Why is this project needed?

These amendments and additions are needed to provide a safe and healthy environment for individuals using public transit.

4. How much will it cost and what is the funding source?

Zero cost.

5. Is there a revenue source associated with this contract? If so, what level of income is projected?

There is no associated revenue source.

6. What will happen if the project is not approved?

The City's ability to provide a safe and healthy environment for transit users is severely restricted.

№ § 7-2-1-2 VIOLATION.

It shall be a violation of \S 7-2-1-1 for any person using the transit system to fail to pay the applicable fare.

9-5-5-4 SMOKING PROHIBITED.

- (A) It is unlawful for a person to smoke in any indoor workplace or indoor public place or in buses, taxicabs or other means of public transit not specifically exempted pursuant to the Albuquerque Clean Indoor Air Ordinance.
- (B) It is unlawful to smoke on the grounds and in all buildings within the Albuquerque Biological Park including the Rio Grande Zoo, Aquarium and Botanical Gardens. (Ord. 21-2008) Penalty, see § 9-5-5-99

9-5-5-9 ENFORCEMENT.

- (A) The Albuquerque Fire or Police Departments or the Bernalillo County Sheriff's Department shall enforce the Albuquerque Clean Indoor Air Ordinance by issuance of a citation.
- (B) A person may register a complaint regarding an alleged violation pursuant to the Albuquerque Clean Indoor Air Ordinance to initiate enforcement of that ordinance with the Mayor or the Albuquerque Fire or Police Departments.
- (C) The designated enforcement agencies may inspect an establishment for compliance with the Albuquerque Clean Indoor Air Ordinance. (Ord. 21-2008)
