1 **COUNCIL PRIORITY: A Federal or State policy, program, or project priority**
2 **included in the annual Federal or State Priority Resolution for Council,**
3 **Councilor, and Mayoral-Administration priorities of the City of Albuquerque as**
4 **adopted through the provisions in Section 2-2-3 ROA 1994 and adopted by a**
5 **majority vote of the City Council.**

6 **COUNCILOR PRIORITY: A Federal or State policy, program, or project**
7 **priority included in the annual Federal or State Priority Resolution for**
8 **Councilor, Councilor and Mayoral-Administration priorities of the City of**
9 **Albuquerque as adopted through the provisions in Section 2-2-3 ROA 1994**
10 **and adopted by a majority vote of the City Council.**

11 **INDEPENDENT PRIORITY: A Federal or State policy, program, or project**
12 **priority of a City Councilor, the City Council, or the Mayor-Administration**
13 **adopted either by a resolution independent of the Annual City Federal or State**
14 **Priority Resolution or communicated independent of a legislative action to the**
15 **Federal or State Government by a City Councilor, the City Council or the**
16 **Mayor-Administration.**

17 **MAYOR-ADMINISTRATION PRIORITY: A Federal or State policy, program, or**
18 **project priority included in the annual Federal or State Priority Resolution for**
19 **Mayoral-Administration priorities of the City of Albuquerque as adopted**
20 **through the provisions in Section 2-2-3. ROA 1994.**

21 **Section 2. Insert a new Section “§ 2-2-3 2 AUTHORITIES AND DUTIES OF**
22 **THE COMMITTEE” and renumber all subsequent sections accordingly:**
23 **“§ 2-2-3 AUTHORITIES AND DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE.**

24 **The Joint Committee on Intergovernmental and Legislative Relations shall**
25 **have the express authority to do the following:**

26 **(A) Promote cooperation and encourage coordination between the City, the**
27 **Federal, and State and local governments;**

28 **(B) Attend such meetings of other governmental entities as may be**
29 **necessary to accomplish the purposes of this article;**

30 **(C) Prepare by September 1st of each calendar year, for approval by the**
31 **Intergovernmental Relations Committee’s, and adoption at the Council**
32 **meeting following the Committee approval, a State legislative program**
33 **resolution that includes the Mayor’s, the City Council’s and City Councilors’**

1 City-Wide policy, program, and capital projects priorities. The priorities shall
2 be submitted as separate attachments to the resolution and adopted by
3 unanimous vote of the City Council. Resolutions, other than the annual City-
4 Wide State Priority Resolution introduced to the City Council that include a
5 City-Wide request to the State Legislature or the State Government shall also
6 be adopted unanimously;

7 (D) Prepare by September 1st of each calendar year, for approval by the
8 Intergovernmental Relations Committee, and adoption at the Council meeting
9 following the Committee approval, a State legislative program resolution that
10 includes the Mayor's, the City Council's and City Councilors' Individual,
11 program, project, and capital outlay project priorities. Such requests shall be
12 submitted as separate attachments to the resolution and adopted by majority
13 vote of the City Council;

14 (E) The resolutions adopted pursuant to paragraphs (C) and (D) of this
15 section and additional requests shall be submitted to the Governor's Office
16 and members of the Legislature whose district include the City of
17 Albuquerque;

18 (F) The Mayor-Administration, Council, and/or individual Councilors may
19 submit to the Legislature and the State Government policy, program, project,
20 and capital outlay project priorities independent of the annual State priorities
21 resolutions;

22 (G) Represent the City and coordinate its legislative efforts at any general
23 or special session of the legislature of the State;

24 (H) Prepare by November 1st of each calendar year for approval by the
25 Intergovernmental Relations Committee, and adoption by the Council at the
26 Council meeting following the committee's approval, a Federal program
27 resolution for the City of Albuquerque's requests for City-Wide policy,
28 program, and grant priorities, and congressional appropriation requests to the
29 Federal government. The priorities shall be submitted as separate attachments
30 to the resolution and adopted by unanimous vote of the City Council.
31 Resolutions, other than the annual City-Wide State Priority Resolution
32 introduced to the City Council that include a City-Wide request to the

1 Congressional Delegation or the Federal Government shall also be adopted
2 unanimously;

3 (I) Prepare by November 1st of each calendar year for approval by the
4 Intergovernmental Relations Committee, and adoption by the Council at the
5 Council meeting following the committee's approval, a Federal program
6 resolution for the City of Albuquerque's requests for Council, Councilor and
7 Mayor-Administration policy, program, and grant priorities, and congressional
8 appropriation requests to the Federal government. The requests shall be
9 submitted on a separate attachment to the resolution and adopted by majority
10 vote of the Council;

11 (J) The resolutions adopted pursuant to paragraphs (J) and (I) of this
12 section and additional requests shall be submitted to the members of the New
13 Mexico Congressional Delegation and agencies of the Federal government, as
14 needed;

15 (K) Congressional appropriation requests filed after the adoption of the
16 Federal priorities resolution shall be submitted through resolution by the
17 Intergovernmental Relations Committee to the City Council for inclusion in
18 the most current Federal policy resolution;

19 (L) The Mayor-Administration, the Council and/or individual Councilors
20 may submit to the Congressional Delegation and the Federal government
21 policy, program, grant priorities, and congressional appropriations requests
22 independent of the annual Federal priorities resolutions;

23 (M) Adopt and promulgate rules, regulations and orders necessary to
24 implement any authority delegated to the committee by this article;

25 (N) Represent the City and coordinate its Federal and State legislative
26 programs in Washington, D.C. and at the State Capitol and with state
27 agencies;

28 (O) Work with the New Mexico Municipal League to coordinate the
29 activities of the City with the programs and activities of other municipalities
30 throughout the state including reviewing and approving the City of
31 Albuquerque's annual membership to the league and any initiatives proposed
32 between the City of Albuquerque and the Municipal League; and

1 (P) Engage and manage the services of representatives at the State and
2 Federal level to assist the committee in carrying out its responsibilities
3 provided in this article including reviewing and submitting for approval to the
4 City Council proposed contracts and legal obligations between the City of
5 Albuquerque and such representatives.”

6 Section 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, sentence,
7 clause, word or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be
8 invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such
9 decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this
10 ordinance. The Council hereby declares that it would have passed this
11 ordinance and each section, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or phrase
12 thereof irrespective of any provision being declared unconstitutional or
13 otherwise invalid.

14 Section 4. COMPILATION. Section 1 and 2 of this ordinance shall be
15 incorporated in and made part of the Revised Ordinances of Albuquerque,
16 New Mexico, 1994.

17 Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect five days
18 after publication by title and general summary.


