ORDINANCE NO. 9952-22

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO PURCHASE A LIFEPAK 15 V4 MONITOR/DEFIB FROM **STRYKER EMS** AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Fire Chief recommends that the City purchase a LIFEPAK 15 V4 Monitor/Defib to assist in life-saving services from the department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Bedford, County of Cuyahoga, and the State of Ohio:

Section 1. Council for the City of Bedford hereby authorizes the City Manager to purchase one (1) Stryker EMS LIFEPAK 15 v4 Monitor/Defib for the total purchase amount of Eighteen **Thousand Three Hundred Sixty-Five Dollars and Zero Cents (\$18,365.00)** as stated above and sign any documents necessary to facilitate the transaction.

Section 2. Council for the City of Bedford hereby authorizes the Finance Director to appropriate and pay the total of **Eighteen Thousand Three Hundred Sixty-Five Dollars and Zero Cents (\$18,365.00)** from **Fund No. 212-1833-00-5-8500-0** to **Stryker Medical** for said equipment.

Section 3. That actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this legislation were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the public peace, health, safety, and welfare and for the further reason that the City of Bedford wants to immediately purchase said equipment to enhance services and assist firefighters.

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest date permitted by law.
