ORDINANCE NO. 9998-22

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT THE PROPOSAL OF **GARDINER** FOR TWO ROOFTOP COMPRESSORS FOR THE MUNICIPAL COMPLEX AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Building Commissioner recommends Gardiner to replace the two rooftop compressors for the Bedford Municipal Court in the Municipal Complex, and

WHEREAS, the current units have failed limiting the air conditioning in the Municipal Court resulting in an emergency repair.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Bedford, County of Cuyahoga, and the State of Ohio:

Section 1. The Council for the City of Bedford hereby authorizes the City Manager to accept the proposal from Gardiner pursuant to the terms contained in the attached estimate.

Section 2. The Council for the City of Bedford hereby authorizes the Finance Director to appropriate and pay the sum of **Twelve Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty-Eight Dollars and Zero Cents (\$12,988.00)** from **Fund No. 110-1778-00-5-9700-0** to **Gardiner** for said services.

Section 3. That actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this legislation were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the City of Bedford, Ohio, and for the further reason that the compressor is in need of immediate replacement.

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest date permitted by law.
