AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 90: ABANDONED AND JUNKED MOTOR VEHICLES OF THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES, BY THE CITY OF GREENVILLE, BOND COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, it is desired that the Greenville Code of Ordinances Chapter 90: Abandoned and Junked Motor Vehicles; be amended in the following respects:

That portion of Section 90.15, being:

90.15 CONDITIONS CAUSING NUISANCE.

(A) Any motor vehicle or part thereof which is inoperable or damaged or deteriorated or in need of repair for seven days or more and is located upon private property in the city, outside of any enclosure which encloses the vehicle completely from lateral view on all sides constitutes a danger to persons, including children, or constitutes a blight upon the property or neighborhood in which it is located, is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

(B) Any motor vehicle which is required by Illinois Statutes to have a valid and current registration in order to be legally operated on public streets and highways and which does not have such registration affixed to it as required by law, and which is kept or stored on private property for 30 days or more other than within a structure permitted under the zoning code or the city that encloses the vehicle(s) on all sides so as to obscure a view of such vehicle (s) is declared to be inoperable and a nuisance.

That portion of Section 90.16, being:

90.16 NOTICE; REMEDIES.

Whenever it shall come to the attention of the City Manager, or Police Chief, that there exists in the city any condition that is set out in §90.15 of this chapter, he shall forthwith give the person in charge or control of the property thereof notice, served upon such person by an officer of the City Police Department or by mailing such notice to his last known address of such person, that such condition exists, and that he shall have seven days from the date of such service in which to remedy the condition or that the city shall cause the condition to be remedied. If the condition is remedied as required by others, than the city or its agents within the said seven days such compliance shall be a defense to a prosecution for failure to comply with this subchapter.

is hereby amended and replaced with the new Sections 90.15 and 90.16 which shall say:

That portion of Section 90.15, being:

90.15 CONDITIONS CAUSING NUISANCE.

(A) Any motor vehicle or part thereof which is inoperable or damaged or deteriorated or in need of repair for seven days or more and is located upon private property in the city, outside of any enclosure which encloses the vehicle completely from lateral view on all sides constitutes a danger to persons, including children, or constitutes a blight upon the property or neighborhood in which it is located, is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

(B) Any motor vehicle which is required by Illinois Statutes to have a valid and current registration in order to be legally operated on public streets and highways and which does not have such registration affixed to it as required by law, and which is kept or stored on private property for fifteen (15) days or more other than within a structure permitted under the zoning code or the city that encloses the vehicle(s) on all sides so as to obscure a view of such vehicle (s) is declared to be inoperable and a nuisance.

That portion of Section 90.16, being:

90.16 NOTICE; REMEDIES.

Whenever it shall come to the attention of the City Manager, Police Chief, Code Enforcement Official or designee, that there exists in the city any condition that is set out in §90.15 of this chapter, he shall forthwith give the person in charge or control of the property thereof notice, served upon such person by an officer of the City Police Department or by mailing such notice to the last known address of such person, that such condition exists, and that he shall have seven days from the date of such service in which to remedy the condition or that the city shall cause the condition to be remedied. If the condition is remedied as required, by other than the city or its agents within the said seven days, such compliance shall be a defense to a prosecution for failure to comply with this subchapter.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Greenville, Bond County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1-GENERAL STATEMENT: That effective May 9, 2017, it is desired that Chapter 90 of City Code be amended in the following respects:

That portion of Section 90.15, being:

90.15 CONDITIONS CAUSING NUISANCE.

(A) Any motor vehicle or part thereof which is inoperable or damaged or deteriorated or in need of repair for seven days or more and is located upon private property in the city, outside of any enclosure which encloses the vehicle completely from lateral view on all sides constitutes a danger to persons, including children, or constitutes a blight upon the property or neighborhood in which it is located, is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

(B) Any motor vehicle which is required by Illinois Statutes to have a valid and current registration in order to be legally operated on public streets and highways

and which does not have such registration affixed to it as required by law, and which is kept or stored on private property for 30 days or more other than within a structure permitted under the zoning code or the city that encloses the vehicle(s) on all sides so as to obscure a view of such vehicle (s) is declared to be inoperable and a nuisance.

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90.16 NOTICE; REMEDIES.

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is hereby amended and replaced with the new Sections 90.15 and 90.16 which shall say:

That portion of Section 90.15, being:

90.15 CONDITIONS CAUSING NUISANCE.

(A) Any motor vehicle or part thereof which is inoperable or damaged or deteriorated or in need of repair for seven days or more and is located upon private property in the city, outside of any enclosure which encloses the vehicle completely from lateral view on all sides constitutes a danger to persons, including children, or constitutes a blight upon the property or neighborhood in which it is located, is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

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defense to a prosecution for failure to comply with this subchapter.

SECTION 2-REPEAL: All prior Ordinances and/or Resolutions, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3-SAVINGS PROVISIONS: In the event any section, subsection, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance should be declared invalid, all other provisions hereof shall not be affected by such invalidity and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4-EFFECTIVE DATE: That this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
