ORDINANCE NO. 3255

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE
OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE
CITY OF GREENVILLE, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, in the opinion of at least a majority of the corporate authorities of the City of Greenville, it is no longer necessary or useful to or for the best interests of the City of Greenville to retain personal property hereinafter described, now owned by it; and

WHEREAS, the City of Greenville desires to dispose of said property by private sale to the highest bidder; and

WHEREAS, the City of Greenville is authorized pursuant to the dictates of 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4 as follows:

"Whenever a city or village incorporated under any general or special law, other than a city or village of 500,000 or more population, owns any personal property which in the opinion of a simple majority of the corporate authorities then holding office, is no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interests of the city or village, such a majority of the corporate authorities then holding office, at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for that purpose, (1) by ordinance may authorize the sale of that personal property in such manner as they may designate, with or without advertising the sale, or (2) may authorize any municipal officer to convert that personal property into some other form that is useful to the city or village by using the material in the personal property, or (3) may authorize any municipal officer to convey or turn in any specified articles of personal property as part payment on a new purchase of any similar article. However, no article shall be turned in as part of the purchase price on any purchase except upon receipt of competitive bids, in such manner as may be prescribed by ordinance, after notice to all bidders that the article will be turned over as part of the purchase price.

In cities or villages of 500,000 or more population, the sale of any such personal property shall be governed by the provisions of Division 10 of Article 8."

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Greenville, Illinois, as follows:

Section One: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the City of Greenville finds that the personal property listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof, now owned, or seized by any lawful process, by the City of Greenville, is no longer necessary or useful to the City of Greenville and the best interests of the City of Greenville will be served by its sale.

Section Two: Pursuant to said Section 5/11-76-4, the City Manager be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to sell the said personal property, after advertisement, to the highest bidder. The City Manager may accept or reject any or all bids. That further, if in the opinion of the City Manager, any of the items of surplus personal property have a market value less than \$50.00, then the City Manager may liquidate same by way of private sale.

Section Three: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, by a majority or all the corporate authorities, and approval in the manner provided by law.

The pledge of allegiance to the United States flag was recited.

Citizen Input: With no comments, citizen input was closed.

Approval of Water Plant Chemical Mixer: Recently the lime slurry mixer motor became inoperable and a temporary mixer was needed while the motor was sent off for repairs. Interim City Manager exercised emergency spending authority to approve a mixer for \$3,153.50 from USA Bluebook. This mixer will serve as a backup in the current plant and new plant should a mixer need to be serviced. Affirm purchase of mixer from USA Bluebook for \$3,153.50.

Ordinance 3255 - Declare Surplus Property – 2002 Ford Crown Victoria: Following the purchase and delivery of the new police vehicle, plans are to sell the oldest car owned by the city, a 2002 Ford Crown Victoria. By state statute the city is required to declare items as surplus property before being sold.
