**AN ORDINANCE DIRECTING THE SALE OF SURPLUS PROPERTY (MILLINGS) BY THE CITY OF  
GREENVILLE, ILLINOIS**

**WHEREAS**, The City of Greenville owns street millings which are not being utilized;

**WHEREAS**, the corporate authorities hereby determine that this surplus property (millings) are no longer necessary, appropriate, required for the use of, profitable to, or for the best interest of the City of Greenville.

**NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE ORDAINED** by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Greenville as follows:

**SECTION 1:** The property (millings), which are not currently being utilized for any purpose, shall be sold for cash. The bids will be received, considered and opened at the Greenville Municipal Building on September 6, 2022 at 10:00 a.m.

**SECTION 2:** The City Clerk shall publish once each week for three (3) successive weeks in the paper published in the City of Greenville, Illinois, notice of this proposal to sell the Property (millings). The first publication shall be on August 2, 2022. Such notice shall contain when the bids will be considered and opened, and shall advertise for bids therefore.

**SECTION 3:** All prior Ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are also hereby repealed.

**SECTION 4:** In the event any section, subsection, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance should be declared invalid, all other provisions hereof shall not be affected by such invalidity and shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 5:** This Ordinance shall become in full force and effect from and upon its passage.


