ORDINANCE NO. 3280

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CITY CODE 31.038 (9) POWER AND DUTIES
OF THE CITY MANAGER FOR THE CITY OF GREENVILLE

The City Council of the City of Greenville, Bond County, Illinois, in meeting assembled, does hereby find and determine as follows:

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Greenville is desirous to amend the financial limit of the City Manager in relation to 31.038(9) as defined in the City Code; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Greenville to adopt an ordinance to amend the city code, namely §31.038(9) Strike from this section of the code, "3,000.00" and change to \$15,000.00 in all places.

NOW THEREFORE, let it be ordained by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Greenville as follows:

SECTION 1 – GENERAL STATEMENT: The City of Greenville’s City Council hereby amends city code §31.038(9) to read: “Supervise the purchase of all materials, supplies and equipment for which funds are provided in the budget; let contracts necessary for operation or maintenance of city services for amounts up to and including ~~\$3,000~~; receive sealed bids for purchases or contracts in excess of \$3,000 and present them to the Council for approval, and advise the Council on the advantages or disadvantages of contract and bid proposals. No purchase shall be made, contract let or obligation incurred for any item or service which exceeds the current budget appropriation without a supplemental appropriation by the Council. No contract in excess of \$3,000 and no contract for new construction shall be let, except by the City Council. The Manager may issue such rules governing purchasing procedures within the administrative organization as the Council shall approve;.

SECTION 2 – REPEAL: All prior Ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are also hereby repealed.


SECTION 3 – SAVINGS PROVISIONS: In the event any section, subsection, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance should be declared invalid, all other provisions hereof shall not be affected by such such invalidity and shall remain in full force and effect.


SECTION 4 – EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall become in effective and in full force from and upon its passage.
