ORDINANCE NO. 3281

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CITY CODE 118.20 (A) and 118.20 (B) LIQUOR
LICENSE CLASSIFICATION FOR THE CITY OF GREENVILLE**

The City Council of the City of Greenville, Bond County, Illinois, in meeting assembled, does hereby find and determine as follows:

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Greenville is desirous to amend the current classes of liquor licenses as defined in the City Code; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Greenville to adopt an ordinance to amend the city code liquor licenses, namely §118.20. (A) Strike from the code, “No single-serving alcoholic liquor shall be sold pursuant to this type A license and §118.20 (B) Strike from the code, “No single-serving alcoholic liquor shall be sold pursuant to this type B license”.

NOW THEREFORE, let it be ordained by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Greenville as follows:

SECTION 1 – GENERAL STATEMENT: The City of Greenville’s City Council hereby amends city code §118.20 (A) and (B).

SECTION 2 – REPEAL: All prior Ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are also hereby repealed.

SECTION 3 – SAVINGS PROVISIONS: In the event any section, subsection, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance should be declared invalid, all other provisions hereof shall not be affected by such invalidity and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4 – EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall become in effective and in full force from and upon its passage.



8. MATTERS OF COUNCIL CONSIDERATION

8.1. Consideration of purchase of new Tornado Siren for the Governor Bond Lake area.

Staff has checked with the insurance company, and if people think there is a siren at the lake, it better work. If there is no expectation that the siren will go off, then the City is not liable. Hollenkamp will have certified letters mailed to the lake residents notifying them that the siren is no longer working and they should use other forms of media for weather information.

Littlefield said maybe put it in budget for next year. He felt like notifying the residents that there is no working siren is needed as soon as possible. Carpenter felt like
