A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE

PILI I KA MAHINA 'ŌLELO HAWAI'I RELATING TO MAHINA 'ŌLELO HAWAI'I.

HO'OPONI 'IA E ka po'e o ke Kūlanakauhale o Honolulu: BE IT ORDAINED by the People of the City and County of Honolulu:

MĀHELE 1. Ke Kumu. 'O ke kumu o kēia kānāwai 'o ia ho'i ke koho kūhelu 'ana i ka mahina 'o Pepeluali 'o ia ho'i ka "Mahina 'Ōlelo Hawai'i," i mea e ho'olaule'a a paipai ai i ka 'ōlelo 'ana i ka 'ōlelo Hawai'i.

Ma ka hapa 'elua o ke kenekulia 'umikūmāiwa, 'o ke aupuni Hawai'i kekahi aupuni 'oi kelakela ma ka heluhelu 'ana. 'O ka 'eha'eha nui na'e, 'o ia ho'i ka pāpā kānāwai 'ia o ka 'ōlelo Hawai'i ma ke 'ano he 'ōlelo ho'ona'auao ma hope o ka ho'okahuli 'ia o ke Aupuni Mō'ī i ka makahiki 1893.

Ma ka makahiki 1978, ua hoʻololi ʻia ke Kumukānāwai o ka Mokuʻāina o Hawaiʻi i ʻike ʻia ka ʻōlelo Hawaiʻi ʻo ia kekahi o nā ʻōlelo kūhelu 'elua o ka Mokuʻāina o Hawaiʻi.

I mea e hoʻōla a pūlama ʻia ai ka ʻōlelo Hawaiʻi, ua hoʻokumu ʻia kekahi mau papahana koʻikoʻi, e laʻa me nā kula kamaliʻi ʻōlelo Hawaiʻi o ka ʻAha Pūnana Leo, ka papahana kula kaiapuni o ke Keʻena Hoʻonaʻauao Hawaiʻi, a me nā papahana ʻōlelo Hawaiʻi o ke Kulanui o Hawaiʻi.

Ma nā makahiki 1990, ua hoʻolaha ʻia kekahi mau kuahaua kiaʻāina koʻikoʻi i pili i ka ʻōlelo Hawaiʻi mai ke kiaʻāina. Ua hoʻolaha ʻia nā kuahaua kiaʻāina o ka makahiki 1994 a me ka makahiki 1995 ma o ka ʻōlelo Pelekānia a me ka ʻōlelo Hawaiʻi, e hoʻolaha ʻia ʻo ka mahina ʻo Pepeluali ma ia mau makahiki kekahi ʻo ia ka "Mahina ʻŌlelo Hawaiʻi ma Hawaiʻi."

I kekahi makahiki mai, ua hoʻolaha ʻia kekahi kuahaua kiaʻāina, ʻo ka makahiki 1996 ka "Makahiki 'Ōlelo Hawaiʻi."

Ma ka makahiki 2007, ua hoʻokumu ka Papa o nā Kahu Kula o ke Kulanui o Hawai'i i ke Kula 'Ike Hawai'i 'o Hawai'inuiākea.

Ma ka makahiki 2013, ua holo ka 'Aha'ōlelo o ke Aupuni Hawai'i, me ka 'āpono pū o ke Kia'āina, i ke Kānāwai 28, 'o ka mahina 'o Pepeluali ka Mahina 'Ōlelo Hawai'i.

I loko nō o holomua nui o kēia au ho'ōla 'ōlelo Hawai'i i loko o nā makahiki he 40, i mea e ola maoli ai ka 'ōlelo makuahine o Hawai'i, he ko'iko'i nō ho'i ka 'ōlelo a

hoʻolauleʻa mau ʻia o ka ʻōlelo Hawaiʻi ma nā ʻano wahi like ʻole, ma nā ʻano pōʻaiapili like ʻole, a ma nā ʻano hanana like ʻole.

MĀHELE 2. Mokuna 1, Nā Kānāwai Hoʻāno Hou ʻla o Honolulu 1990 ("'Ōlelo Pili I ʻŌ I ʻAneʻi"), i hoʻololi ʻia ma o ka pākuʻi ʻana i kekahi ʻatikala hou no ke koho kūpono ʻia ʻana e ke Kanaka Hoʻoponopono Kānāwai, a heluhelu ʻia penei:

"'Atikala ___. Mahina 'Ōlelo Hawai'i

Mahina 'Ōlelo Hawai'i. E 'ike mau a e kapa 'ia ana a'e ka mahina 'o Pepeliali 'o ia ka "Mahina 'Ōlelo Hawai'i" i mea e ho'omaika'i a e paipai aku ai i ka 'ōlelo 'ana o ua 'ōlelo makuahine nei la. 'A'ole e kū ana kēia mahina i kapa 'ia ka "Mahina 'Ōlelo Hawai'i" i Iānui o ke kūlanakauhale.

MĀHELE 3. E holo kēia kānāwai ma kona 'āpono 'ia."

(English Translation)

SECTION 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to designate the month of February as "Mahina Ōlelo Hawai'i" (Hawaiian Language Month) to celebrate and encourage the use of the Hawaiian language.

In the second half of the 19th century, the Hawaiian nation was among the most literate in the world. Tragically, three years after the overthrow of the Hawaiian monarchy in 1893, Hawaiian was outlawed as a language of education in Hawaiii.

In 1978, the Hawai'i State Constitution was amended to recognize the Hawaiian language as one of the two official languages of the State of Hawai'i.

To save the Hawaiian language, a number of historic initiatives were launched, including 'Aha Pūnana Leo's Hawaiian language immersion preschools, the Department of Education's Hawaiian language immersion program, and the Hawaiian language programs of the University of Hawaii system.

Several important gubernatorial proclamations on 'Õlelo Hawai'i were issued in the 1990s. In 1994 and 1995, gubernatorial proclamations, written both in Hawaiian and English, were issued recognizing February 1994 and February 1995 as "Hawaiian Language Month in Hawai'i."

The following year, another gubernatorial proclamation was issued that recognized 1996 as "Year of the Hawaiian language."

In 2007, the Board of Regents of the University of Hawai'i established the Hawai'inuiākea School of Hawaiian Knowledge.

In 2013, the Hawaii State Legislature passed, and the Governor approved, Act 28, declaring February as Mahina 'Ōlelo Hawai'i.

While the Hawaiian language revitalization movement has made major strides in the last 40 years, for 'Ōlelo Hawai'i to not just survive, but to also thrive, more people need to speak Hawaiian and have spaces and occasions to celebrate and use it.

SECTION 2. Chapter 1, Revised Ordinances of Honolulu 1990 ("General Provisions"), is amended by adding a new article to be appropriately designated by the Revisor of Ordinances and to read as follows:

"Article ___. Mahina 'Ōlelo Hawai'i

'Ōlelo Hawai'i Month. The month of February shall be known and designated as "'Ōlelo Hawai'i Month" to celebrate and encourage the use of Hawaiian language. This month is not and shall not be construed as a city holiday."
