**ORDINANCE NO. 25-06**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MARISSA,  
ILLINOIS, AMENDING SECTIONS 53.019 & 54.004 OF THE VILLAGE CODE**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Marissa, St. Clair County, Illinois (“Village”), is a duly created, organized and validly existing municipality of the State of Illinois under the 1970 Illinois Constitution and the laws of the State of Illinois, including particularly the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, a public meeting was held in the Village of Marissa, Illinois at the Marissa Village Hall, 111 N. Main Street, Marissa, Illinois, on July 21, 2025, at 7:00 p.m., before the Village Board of Marissa and notice of said meeting was duly given; and

**WHEREAS**, the Corporate Authorities of the Village may amend the Village Code from time to time pursuant to §10.009 of the Village Code, and Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-1-1, *et seq.*); and

**WHEREAS**, the Village desires to amend Title V (Public Works), Chapter 53 (Water), §53.019 of its Village Code as follows (addition in **bold italics**):

**§ 53.019 INSTALLING AND MAINTAINING SERVICE LINES.**

(A) The user shall be responsible for installation and maintenance of service lines between the meter and the residence or business. Such service lines must be at least three-fourths of an inch in diameter, and must be installed at a minimum depth of three feet. Service lines must have a minimum working pressure rating of 160 psi at 73.4°F and must be constructed of one of the following types of materials: copper (Type K), polyvinyl chloride (PVC), polyethylene, or polybutylene. Service lines shall not be covered until they are inspected and approved by the Superintendent.

(B) The user shall not connect any service line or any plumbing connected with the service line to any other water source. The service line shall meet all requirements of the State Environmental Protection Agency’s rules and regulations, the State Plumbing Code, being Ill. Admin. Code tit. 77, pt. 890, and the regulations in this chapter.

*(C) All new or replacement service lines that are non-metallic/non-conductive shall have a tracer wire installed at the time of service line installation/replacement.*

**WHEREAS**, the Village desires to amend Title V (Public Works), Chapter 54 (Sewage), §54.004 of its Village Code as follows (addition in **bold italics**):

**§ 54.004 USER RESPONSIBILITY.**

(A) *Installing and maintaining service lines.* The user shall be responsible for installation and maintenance of service lines between the manhole or sewer main and the residence or business of the user. Such service lines must be installed according to the specifications as required by the village. Service lines must not be covered until they are inspected and approved by a duly authorized village representative. The user will not connect any service line or any plumbing connected with the service line until approved by the village. The service line must meet any requirements of the State Environmental Protection Agency, ***and all connections to either the manhole or sewer main shall be done by an Illinois licensed plumber at the user's expense.***

(B) *Easements.* The user shall give such easements and rights-of-way as necessary to the village and allow access for the purpose of construction, repair, maintenance, and relocation or expansion of the sewer system. The necessity shall be determined by the Board of Trustees.

(C) *Damage to the village.* No user shall tamper, adjust, damage in any manner, or interfere with the components or operation of the sewer system owned by the village.

(D) *Specified uses.* Users may discharge into the sewage collection facility of the village only waste which is produced in the ordinary domestic or farm use upon the premises of the user, provided:

(1) No user shall charge another person for the discharge of waste through the user's property;

(2) Each dwelling, apartment, business, and livestock tap is a separate unit. The user must make application for service for each unit, and each unit shall have a separate service line, unless otherwise approved by the Board of Trustees. Each user shall pay the minimum monthly rate and other rates and fees hereby established for each unit; and

(3) Uses other than ordinary domestic and farm use may be approved by the Board of Trustees upon such specific terms and conditions as may be set forth by the Board of Trustees in each case.

**WHEREAS,** the President and Board of Trustees of the Village have determined that it is in the best interest of the Village, its citizens and the public health, safety and welfare to make the aforementioned amendments to the Village Code.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MARISSA, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1:** That the foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated herein as findings of the President and Board of Trustees.

**Section 2:** That Title V (Public Works), Chapter 53 (Water), §53.019 of the Village Code shall be amended to read as follows:

**§ 53.019 INSTALLING AND MAINTAINING SERVICE LINES.**

(A) The user shall be responsible for installation and maintenance of service lines between the meter and the residence or business. Such service lines must be at least three-fourths of an inch in diameter, and must be installed at a minimum depth of three feet. Service lines must have a minimum working pressure rating of 160 psi at 73.4°F and must be constructed of one of the following types of materials: copper (Type K), polyvinyl chloride (PVC), polyethylene, or polybutylene. Service lines shall not be covered until they are inspected and approved by the Superintendent.

(B) The user shall not connect any service line or any plumbing connected with the service line to any other water source. The service line shall meet all requirements of the State Environmental Protection Agency's rules and regulations, the State Plumbing Code, being Ill. Admin. Code tit. 77, pt. 890, and the regulations in this chapter.

(C) All new or replacement service lines that are non-metallic/non-conductive shall have a tracer wire installed at the time of service line installation/replacement.

**Section 3:** That Title V (Public Works), Chapter 54 (Sewer), §54.004 of the Village Code shall be amended to read as follows:

**§ 54.004 USER RESPONSIBILITY.**

(A) *Installing and maintaining service lines.* The user shall be responsible for installation and maintenance of service lines between the manhole or sewer main and the residence or business of the user. Such service lines must be installed according to the specifications as required by the village. Service lines must not be covered until they are inspected and approved by a duly authorized village representative. The user will not connect any service line or any plumbing connected with the service line until approved by the village. The service line must meet any requirements of the State Environmental Protection Agency, and all connections to either the manhole or sewer main shall be done by an Illinois licensed plumber at the user's expense.

(B) *Easements.* The user shall give such easements and rights-of-way as necessary to the village and allow access for the purpose of construction, repair, maintenance, and relocation or expansion of the sewer system. The necessity shall be determined by the Board of Trustees.

(C) *Damage to the village.* No user shall tamper, adjust, damage in any manner, or interfere with the components or operation of the sewer system owned by the village.

(D) *Specified uses.* Users may discharge into the sewage collection facility of the village only waste which is produced in the ordinary domestic or farm use upon the premises of the user, provided:

(1) No user shall charge another person for the discharge of waste through the user's property;

(2) Each dwelling, apartment, business, and livestock tap is a separate unit. The user must make application for service for each unit, and each unit shall have a separate service line, unless otherwise approved by the Board of Trustees. Each user shall pay the minimum monthly rate and other rates and fees hereby established for each unit; and

(3) Uses other than ordinary domestic and farm use may be approved by the Board of Trustees upon such specific terms and conditions as may be set forth by the Board of Trustees in each case.

**Section 4:** All other sections of Title V, Chapters 53 and 54 of the Village Code, to the extent not in conflict herewith, shall remain in full force and effect.

**Section 5:** All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**Section 6:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, and after publication in pamphlet form, as provided by law.


