

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND ESTABLISHING TRUCK ROUTES  
THROUGH THE VILLAGE OF NAVARRE AND EXPANDING ON EXISTING  
MUNICIPAL REGULATION SEC. 70.21, AND ENACTING NEW  
MUNICIPAL REGULATION 70.22

Whereas, the Village of Navarre desires to designate and identify truck routes through the Village, and

Whereas, the Village of Navarre has numerous dedicated Village streets that are not a federal, state, or county highway, and

Whereas, many streets or intersections in the Village of Navarre that intersect or connect with or continue off of federal, state, or county highways are not be built or designed to suitably handle trucks as identified herein, and thus it is in the interest of the Village to designate alternate routes for truck traffic, and

Whereas, among the Village streets that is not built or designed for safe use by truck traffic, as defined herein, is Wooster Street, inasmuch as Wooster Street is residential, has on-street parking, and its various intersections are not designed for the type of wide turns/turning radius required by such truck traffic.

Whereas, Village Council wishes to designate truck routes for through traffic from Prospect Industrial Park or other locations outside of the Village, and

Whereas, the Village of Navarre already has a codified Municipal Regulation, Sec. 70.21 passed as Ordinance 16-2022, which reads as set forth below.

*“Section 70.21 – Through Truck Traffic Limited on Market Street –  
Through truck traffic shall not be permitted on Market Street within the Village of Navarre. Trucks are defined to include both semi-tractor trailers (fifty-three-foot trailers) and roll-off trucks, such as the type used to haul garbage to landfills. “Through traffic” is defined as traveling from outside the Village to outside the Village, without stopping for any legitimate business purpose within the Village. Violation of this Section is a minor misdemeanor, and a second offense within one year of a first violation of this section is a fourth-degree misdemeanor.”*

Now Therefore, Village Council Ordains as follows, enacting new Section 70.22 to be included in its codified Municipal Regulations:

*“Section 70.22 – Truck Routes and Through Truck Routes in the Village of Navarre*

*(a) Through truck traffic shall not be permitted on residential streets within the Village of Navarre unless otherwise permitted in the Village codified Municipal Regulations. Trucks are defined to include both semi-tractor trailers (fifty-three-foot trailers) and roll-off trucks, such as the type used to haul garbage to landfills. “Through traffic” is defined as*

for any legitimate business purpose within the Village.

(b) State Route 21 (SR21), United States Route 62 (SR62), Sterilite Street NE and Canal Street East are designated as "truck routes."

(c) Through truck traffic is permitted only on Village designated truck routes.

(d) Through truck traffic is not permitted on Wooster Street or other Village residential streets.

(e) Through truck traffic approaching the Village of Navarre from the east on Fohl Street SW shall use Sterilite Street NE to Navarre Road SW as a way around the residential portion of the Village.

(f) Through truck traffic approaching the Village of Navarre from the west on Elton Street SW, shall detour toward SR62 or Warmington Road SW before Elton Street SW connects with Wooster Street.

(g) Wooster Street is not to be used as a "cut-through" for through truck traffic or truck traffic described in subsection (h) below.

(h) Truck traffic to and from facilities in Prospect Industrial Park along Sterilite Street NE, that otherwise has no legitimate business purpose for stopping elsewhere within the Village, shall enter and depart Prospect Industrial Park only from or to Sterilite Street NE-Navarre Road SW or Fohl Street SW away from the residential portion of the Village.

(i) Through truck traffic entering the Village on a designated truck route shall pass through the Village only on designated truck routes, and shall not detour onto Wooster Street or other residential streets.

(j) Violation of this Section is a minor misdemeanor, and a second offense within one year of a first violation of this section is a fourth-degree misdemeanor.
