## ORDINANCE NO. 9457 (NEW SERIES)

## AN ORDINANCE ADDING ARTICLE IIIr TO THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY ADMISTRATIVE CODE ESTABLISHING A REGIONAL SECURITY COMMISSION

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego ordains as follows:

Section 1. Article IIIr (commencing with Section 84.300) is added to the San Diego County Administrative Code to read as follows:

## ARTICLE IIIr

## REGIONAL SECURITY COMMISSION

Sec. 84.300. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION.

There is hereby established the San Diego County Regional Security Commission ("Commission"),

Sec. 84.301. APPOINTMENTS TO COMMISSION-TERMS OF OFFICE.

The Commission shall consist of five members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate one member for appointment to the Commission . To the extent practicable, the Board of Supervisors will appoint members having knowledge and expertise in the areas of public health, security matters or law enforcement. The Chair of the Commission shall be the nominee of the Chair of the Board of Supervisors. All members of the Commission shall hold office for a term coterminous with the term of the member of Board of supervisors who nominated the member. Members of the commission shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors and may be removed by the Board of Supervisors without cause.

Sec. 84.302. MEETINGS.

The commission shall establish its meeting schedule. The Commission shall conduct all meetings in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act.

Sec. 84.303. DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION.

The commission shall advise the Board of Supervisors and the County as to homeland security matters with particular emphasis on recommending the expenditure of funds received from the State and Federal governments for use in the areas of law enforcement and public health related to homeland security.

Sec. 84.304. STAFF

The Chief Administrative Officer shall determine the staff necessary to serve the commission.

Sec. 84.305. SUNSET PROVISION.

Notwithstanding any other provision of the Code, the Sunset review process for the Article shall commence June 1, 2005.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after the date of its passage, and before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage it shall be published once, with the names of members voting for and against the same in the San Diego Commerce, a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Diego.
