ORDINANCE NO. 9577 (NEW SERIES)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY CODE OF REGULATORY ORDINANCES RELATING TO FEES FOR AUTOMATED POINT-OF-SALE STATIONS

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego ordains as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Supervisors finds that small businesses that have no more than three point-of-sale stations in addition to registered weighing and measuring devices warrant exemption from point-of-sale permit fees. Accordingly, the Board of Supervisors finds and determines that an amendment is necessary to revise the point-of-sale annual permit fee exemption.

Section 2. Section 21.2003 of the San Diego County Code of Regulatory Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

SEC 21.2003. PERMIT CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENT/EXEMPTIONS.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for a person to use a point-of-sale station for commercial purposes without first obtaining a permit in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter. A separate permit shall be required for each establishment location.
- (b) A person using not more than three point-of-sale stations for commercial purposes in an establishment of 3,500 square feet or less of enclosed retail structure and with commercial devices validly registered with the county sealer pursuant to Chapter 17 of Division 1 of Title 2 of the San Diego County Code of Regulatory Ordinances shall be exempt from the fee requirements of this Chapter.
- **Section 3.** This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days after its passage, and before the expiration of fifteen days after its passage, a summary hereof shall be published once with the names of the members of this Board voting for and against it in a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Diego.
