ORDINANCE NO 9587 (NEW SERIES)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, SECTION 496, RELATING TO AUTOMOBILE ALLOWANCE.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego ordains as follows:

Section 1. Section 496 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 496 AUTOMOBILE ALLOWANCE

Each of the County Officers and Executive Management Staff hereinafter designated, as such designation may be hereafter modified from time to time, may elect to be paid a monthly allowance as hereinafter set forth for the use of a non-county vehicle in the performance of their duties subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The allowance shall cover all costs of acquisition, maintenance, servicing, lubrication, fuel and operation of said vehicle for such County use.
- (b) Each such officer shall at his own expense for the period covered by such allowance provide insurance protecting such officer in the use of such vehicle against liability for bodily injury and property damage in not less than the following amounts: bodily injury, each person, \$100,000; each accident \$300,000; property damage \$25,000.
- (c) Election to utilize the allowance shall be in writing and filed with the Chief Administrative Officer.
- (d) The following table of rates of automobile allowances are established, and officers authorized to receive such allowances shall be paid that monthly amount set forth in the allowance rate appearing after the title of that officer:

SECTION 3.5.4 3.6.20: <u>UNCLASSIFIED MANAGEMENT RELOCATION ALLOWANCE</u>. Upon determination by the appointing authority and approval by the Chief Administrative Officer that relocation allowance is appropriate to facilitate recruitment or selection for an appointment to a vacant position in a class designated UM, a relocation allowance in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 may be authorized for the actual and reasonable relocation expenses incurred incidental to relocation of the appointee and his/her immediate family to San Diego County. SECTION 1.4.17: SALARY ADVANCEMENT WITHIN RANGE FOR CHILD SUPPORT PROGRAM ATTORNEY CLASS (3917): For the Child Support Program Attorney class 3917, those employees serving in Step 4 for at least the number of hours equivalent to twenty six (26) weeks of full time service shall advance to Step 5, provided that for the preceding performance rating period, the employees' overall performance was rated standard or higher. Advancement within range to the next higher step for all other employees in this class shall be fifty two (52) weeks of full time service or its equivalent, provided that for the preceding performance rating period, the employees' overall performance was rated standard or higher.
