ORDINANCE NO.9588(N.S.)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE COUNTY CODE OF REGULATORY ORDINANCES RELATING TO LIFTING OF THE SOUTH CITRUS AVENUE SEPTIC SYSTEM MORATORIUM

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego ordains as follows:

- Section 1. Purpose This Ordinance provides for lifting the South Citrus Avenue septic system moratorium. Recent study by the County demonstrates that if other County regulatory and permitting requirements for such systems are rigorously applied, the moratorium is no longer needed. This ordinance also provides authority for the Director of the Department of Environmental Health to approve the use of mound systems to elevate leach fields in the South Citrus Avenue basin area, on a case-by-case basis.
 - Section 2. Section 51.0004 of the County Code of Regulatory Ordinances is hereby repealed.
 - Section 3. Section 68.330.3 of the County Code of Regulatory Ordinances is hereby repealed.
 - Section 4. Section 81.108.12 of the County Code of Regulatory Ordinances is hereby repealed.
- Section 5. Section 68.309 of the County Code of Regulatory Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 68.309. [ALTERNATIVE ON-SITE WASTEWATER SYSTEM.]

"ALTERNATIVE ON-SITE WASTEWATER SYSTEM" shall mean any approved, individual, on-site sewage disposal system for installation in the Central Basin Area of the Valley Center Community Plan (within the area shown on a map on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors as Document No. 0767381), and in the South Citrus Avenue Basin Area as shown on a map on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors as Document No., other than a leach line or seepage pit disposal system.

Section 6. Effective Date & Publication. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days after its passage, and before the expiration of fifteen days after its passage, a summary hereof shall be published once with the names of the members of the Board voting for and against it in the San Diego Commence, a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Diego.
