## ORDINANCE NO. <u>9745</u> (NEW SERIES)

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 6930 OF THE ZONING CODE OF SAN DIEGO COUNTY RELATING TO ADULT ENTERTAINMENT ESTABLISHMENTS

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego ordains as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Supervisors finds and determines that it is appropriate to amend The Zoning Ordinance to reduce the processing time of Administrative Permits for Adult Entertainment Establishments as a result of the federal district court decision in *Fantasyland Video Inc, v. County of San Diego,* 373 F. Supp. 2d 1094 (2005).

**Section 2.** Subsection (b)(1) of section 6930 of The Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

- a. [No change.]
- b. Permit Required: Standards for Location.

1. No person shall cause or permit the establishment, operation, enlargement or transfer of ownership or control of any adult entertainment establishment without first obtaining an Administrative Permit pursuant to this section from the Director.

- i. Upon receipt of an application, the Director shall send a notification to all occupants and owners of record of properties within a 1,000-foot radius of the proposed site.
- ii. Interested persons notified under section subsection b.1.i may submit written comments to the Director solely on the issue of whether or not the proposed site complies with subsection b.2.
- iii. The Director shall make a decision to grant or deny the Administrative Permit within 15 days of the initial filing of the application.

- iv. The Director shall make a decision based solely upon the completeness of the application and evidence relevant to the objective zoning and distance standards specified in subsection b.2, including any written comments from interested persons.

- 3. [No change.]

**Section 3**. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its passage, and before the expiration of 15 days after its passage, a summary hereof shall published once with the names of the members of this Board voting for and against it in the <u>San Diego Commerce</u>, a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Diego.
