Section 4. Section 1.12.2 of the Compensation Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

## SECTION 1.12.2: AMERICAN BOARD CERTIFICATE.

(a) <u>Medical Specialty.</u> Eligible employees shall be paid approximately ten percent (10%) upon furnishing satisfactory evidence that they have earned a valid certificate issued by the American Board in the medical specialty determined by the Director to be especially suited to the position held.

(b) <u>Medical Subspecialty.</u> Eligible employees shall be paid an additional five 5% upon furnishing satisfactory evidence that they have earned a valid certificate issued by the American Board in the medical subspecialty determined by the Director to be especially suited to the position held. Eligible employees in possession of both a Medical Specialty and a Subspecialty, or multiple Subspecialty certificates, may receive up to 15% for the combined certificates.

- Section 5. Section 2.1.3 of the Compensation Ordinance is hereby added to read as follows:

SECTION 2.1.3: RELOCATION ALLOWANCE FOR HARD-TO-RECRUIT PROFESSIONAL CLASSES. Upon approval by the Chief Administrative Officer, a relocation allowance, up to \$8,000, may be authorized for professional classes designated by the Director as Hard-to-Recruit. Relocation expenses may include, but are not limited to, personal transportation, moving expenses and temporary housing. Approval must be obtained prior to any job offer. Claims for expenses submitted pursuant to this provision shall be subject to review and determination by the Auditor and Controller prior to reimbursement.

#### Section 6. Section 3.5.4. of the Compensation Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

UNCLASSIFIED MANAGEMENT RELOCATION ALLOWANCE. Upon determination by the appointing authority and approval by the Chief Administrative Officer that relocation allowance is appropriate to facilitate recruitment or selection for an appointment to a vacant position in a class designated UM, NA or NE a relocation allowance in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 may be authorized for the actual and reasonable relocation expenses incurred incidental to relocation of the appointee and his/her immediate family to San Diego County. Expenses may include, but are not limited to, personal transportation, moving expenses for household goods, and temporary housing arrangements. Claims for expenses submitted pursuant to this provision shall be subject to review and determination by the Auditor and Controller prior to reimbursement.

Section 7. Section 4.2.4 of the Compensation Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

## SECTION 4.2.4: BEREAVEMENT LEAVE.

- (a) <u>Definition</u>. Bereavement leave is paid leave which is available to an employee at the time of death or funeral of a member of the employee's immediate family as defined below in section 4.2.4(e).
- (b) Eligibility. Only biweekly rate employees on paid status shall be eligible for paid bereavement leave.
- Amount of Leave. Bereavement leave shall not exceed three (3) work days for the death of the employee's (c) immediate family. Also, an employee shall be entitled to use two (2) days of sick leave as bereavement leave.
- Use. Bereavement leave may only be taken at the time of the death or funeral of a member of the (d) employee's immediate family, and shall not be deducted from other leaves of absence or compensatory time off for which the employee may be eligible. (See Section 4.2.2 (e) (6) for possible combination with sick leave.)

(e) <u>Immediate Family.</u> Means husband, wife, child, stepchild, brother, stepbrother, sister, stepsister, parent, stepparent, any person serving or who as served as a parent, grandparent, grandchild, parent-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, any other person living in the same household as the employee.

**Section 8.** Effective Date. Sections 2, 4, 5, 6 and 7of this ordinance affect compensation and shall take effect upon adoption. Within fifteen days after the date of adoption of this ordinance, a summary shall be published once with the name of those members voting for and against the same in the newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Diego.
