ORDINANCE NO. 9954 (N.S.)

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 21.2003(b) OF THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY CODE OF REGULATORY ORDINANCES RELATING TO FEES FOR AUTOMATED POINT-OF-SALE SYSTEMS

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego ordains as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Supervisors finds that it is in the public interest to eliminate the fee exemption for the businesses using not more than three point-of-sale stations for commercial purposes in an establishment of 3,500 square feet or less of enclosed retail structure with commercial devices already validly registered with the County Sealer. The Board finds that the combined inspections of various devices did not result in any cost savings that was the basis for allowing this fee exemption.

Section 2. Section 21.2003 (b) of the San Diego County Code of Regulatory Ordinances is hereby repealed.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its passage, and before the expiration of 15 days after its passage, a summary hereof shall be published once with the names of the members of this Board voting for and against it in <u>San Diego Commerce</u>, a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Diego.

Section 5. Operative Date. This ordinance shall be operative on October 1, 2008.
