## RESOLUTION No. 210406-041

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency has received a request from the District Attorney's Office and the Department of Adult Probation for parking and traffic modifications as follows:

- A. RESCIND TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANYTIME EXCEPT VEHICLES DISPLAYING A PERMIT ISSUED BY THE SFMTA Brannan Street, north side, from 15 feet to 115 feet east of Boardman Place and from 16 feet to 116 feet west of Boardman Place
- B. ESTABLISH GENERAL METERED PARKING, NO TIME LIMIT, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY 9AM-6PM Brannan Street, north side, from 15 feet to 115 feet east of Boardman Place and from 16 feet to 116 feet west of Boardman Place
- C. RESCIND 2-HOUR PARKING, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, 7AM-6PM Bryant Street, south side, from 72 feet to 117 feet south of Langton Street
- D. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANYTIME EXCEPT VEHICLES DISPLAYING A PERMIT ISSUED BY THE SFMTA, AT ALL TIMES Bryant Street, south side, from 72 feet to 117 feet south of Langton Street; and,

WHEREAS, The proposed amendments to the Transportation Code rescind parking restrictions on the north side of Brannan Street from 15 feet to 115 feet east of Boardman Place and from 16 feet to 116 feet west of Boardman Place to establish general metered parking regulations and rescind 2-Hour Parking restrictions to establish parking restrictions except vehicles displaying a permit issued by the SFMTA on the south side of Bryant Street, from 72 feet to 117 feet south of Langton Street and,

WHEREAS, SFMTA staff agreed to pursue the additional parking restriction and amend the Transportation Code; and,

WHEREAS, The public has been notified about the proposed modifications and has been given the opportunity to comment on these modifications through the public hearing process; and,

WHEREAS, The proposed parking modifications are subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA); CEQA provides a categorical exemption from environmental review for operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities as defined in Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301; and,

WHEREAS, On January 8, 2021, the SFMTA, under authority delegated by the Planning Department, determined (Case Number 2021-000590ENV) that the proposed parking modifications are categorically exempt from CEQA as defined in Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301; and,

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WHEREAS, The proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by the S. F. Administrative Code Chapter 31; and,

WHEREAS, A copy of the CEQA determination is on file with the Secretary to the SFMTA Board of Directors, and may be found in the records of the Planning Department at <a href="https://sfplanning.org/">https://sfplanning.org/</a> and 49 South Van Ness Avenue, Suite 1400 in San Francisco, and is incorporated herein by reference; and,

WHEREAS, The proposed action for adopting parking restrictions is the Final SFMTA Decision as defined by Ordinance 127-18; and,

WHEREAS, Final SFMTA Decisions can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors and the proposed parking restrictions, set forth as Items A through D, are subject to Board of Supervisors review because the SFMTA is creating and eliminating a preferential parking zone and the SFMTA is creating a parking meter zone; and now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors amends the Transportation Code, Division II, Section 801 to rescind existing parking restrictions in order to establish general metered parking on Brannan Street and rescind 2-Hour Parking restrictions to establish parking restrictions on Bryant Street except for vehicles displaying an SFMTA issued permit; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors approves the parking and traffic regulations, as set forth in Items A through D, to rescind existing parking restrictions in order to establish general metered parking on Brannan Street and rescind 2-Hour Parking restrictions to establish parking restrictions on Bryant Street except for vehicles displaying an SFMTA issued permit.

[Transportation Code – Brannan and Bryant Street Parking Restrictions]

Resolution amending Division II of the Transportation Code regarding parking restrictions on Brannan Street and Bryant Street in the South of Market area.

NOTE: Additions are <u>single-underline Times New Roman</u>; deletions are <u>strike-through Times New Roman</u>.

The Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors of the City and County of San Francisco enacts the following regulations:

Section 1. Article 800 of Division II of the Transportation Code is hereby amended by revising Section 801, to read as follows:

SEC. 801. PARKING RESTRICTIONS BY LOCATION.

(c) Restricted Locations:

\* \* \* \*

(8) Brannan Street.

(A) Locations:

(i) Brannan Street, north side, from 15 feet to 115 feet east of Boardman Place (100 foot zone);

(ii) Brannan Street, north side, from 16 feet to 116 feet west of Boardman Place (100 foot zone).

(B) Time: All times.

(C) Exempt Vehicles: City owned vehicles displaying a permit issued by the SFMTA.

(8) Bryant Street near Langton Street (south side).

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(A) **Location:** The south side of Bryant Street, from 72 feet to 117 feet south

of Langton Street (45-foot zone).

(B) <u>Time:</u> All times.

(C) **Exempt Vehicles:** City-owned vehicles displaying a permit issued by the

SFMTA.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 31 days after

enactment. Enactment occurs when the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency

Board of Directors approves this ordinance.

Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the San Francisco

Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors intends to amend only those words,

phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, letters, punctuation marks,

charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Transportation Code that are explicitly

shown in this ordinance as additions or deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears

under the official title of the ordinance.
