

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING THE PENNSYLVANIA  
TELEPHONE COMPANY THE RIGHT TO OCCUPY  
THE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE BOROUGH  
YOE, PA., WITH POLES AND WIRES AS MAY  
BE NECESSARY FOR CONDUCTING ITS BUSINESS.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted, etc. That permission be and is hereby granted The Pennsylvania Telephone Company to occupy the streets and highways of the borough of Yoe, Pa., with poles and wires as may be necessary for conducting its business and to maintain the same in good, safe and servicable condition.

SECTION 2. That all poles shall be erected under the supervision of the committee on highways of said borough.

SECTION 3. That it is hereby expressly understood and agreed between the borough of Yoe, Pa., and The Pennsylvania Telephone Company, that the privilege herein granted by the former are given in consideration of the latter agreeing for itself, its successors and assigns that when the said borough of Yoe, Pa., shall adopt a fire alarm telegraph, the said The Pennsylvania Telephone Company shall permit the fire alarm wire to be run upon all the poles of the said Company within the limits of the borough aforesaid, without compensation. Provided, that the said, The Pennsylvania Telephone Company, shall comply with the existing legal ordinances and all further legal ordinances of said Borough of Yoe, imposing an annual tax on all poles within the limits of said Borough, and shall also pay the costs of printing and advertising this ordinance, as required by law.
