

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING PERMISSION TO THE AMERICAN TELEGRAPH AND TELEPHONE COMPANY OF PENNSYLVANIA TO CONSTRUCT ITS LINES OF POLES AND WIRES UPON AND ALONG THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS OF THE BOROUGH OF YOE, COUNTY OF YORK AND STATE OF PENNSYLVANIA, UPON THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS THEREIN STATED.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Borough of Yoe, County of York and State of Pennsylvania, that The American Telegraph and Telephone Company of Pennsylvania, its successors or assigns, be and the same are hereby granted the right, privilege and authority to construct, operate and maintain its lines of poles, wires and fixtures upon, along, over and under the public highways of the said Borough of Yoe, upon the following terms and conditions, viz:

SECTION 1. All poles shall be reasonably straight; they shall be located under the supervision and direction of the Committee on Streets of said Town Council and shall be so placed as not to interfere with the ordinary use of said highways or so as to obstruct ditches, drains or entrances to gateways or driveways.

SECTION 2. Said Company shall hold said Borough free and harmless from any and all damages caused by the construction or negligent maintenance of its said line in said Borough.

SECTION 3. Said Company shall be subject at any and all times to any and all general ordinances now existing or that may hereafter be passed relating to the use of public highways or other public places in said Borough.

SECTION 4. In consideration of the rights and privileges herein granted said Borough shall have the right to attach the wires of its fire alarm and police telegraph system to any and all poles erected under the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
