

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF YOE BOROUGH,
YORK COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING A ONE-WAY
WESTERLY TRAFFIC PATTERN ON EAST PENNSYLVANIA AVENUE

ORDINANCE NO. 2004 - 02

WHEREAS, East Pennsylvania Avenue is a duly adopted Borough Street; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council in its charge to adequately protect the general health, safety, and welfare of the Citizens of Yoe Borough has determined that a traffic study regarding traffic patterns on East Pennsylvania Avenue should be undertaken by Borough Council; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Borough Code, the Borough has sought the advice of the York County Planning Commission by formally requesting a traffic and engineering study; and

WHEREAS, a traffic and engineering study was conducted by the York County Planning Commission which recommended the establishment of a one-way street on East Pennsylvania Avenue in a westerly direction; and

WHEREAS, the York County Planning Commission has recommended that such a one-way street be adopted and properly posted.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, AND IT IS HEREBY ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY BOROUGH COUNCIL OF YOE BOROUGH, YORK COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AS FOLLOWS:

1. East Pennsylvania Avenue shall heretofore become a one-way street in a westerly direction.
2. Borough Council or its designated representative(s) is/are hereby authorized to erect any and all appropriate signs to duly post East Pennsylvania Avenue and the approaches thereto so as to notify the public that East Pennsylvania Avenue is a one-way street.
3. By enacting this Ordinance, the Borough hereby repeals any and all other Ordinances heretofore adopted which are inconsistent herewith.

Visitors:

- Vicki Burke from 38 E. PA Ave. came to complain about rats living along the old railroad tracks. Also, 30 E. PA Ave is vacant and looks like a jungle. This property also has groundhogs.
- Mr. Ronald Weitkamp attended on rabbits and dogs feces piling up and being a health hazard at 52 E. PA Ave. He stated that the smell is awful. He also complained about the weeds being too high at the railroad property. This will be taken care of when we get a new tractor. At 39 E. PA Ave there are new people with 2 dogs and the dogs are going on Larry Schmidt's property and not cleaned up.
- Denny has given a letter to the people at 39 E. PA Ave already as the house at 30 E. PA Ave has. Denny has talked to Fred Houser several times. Denny stated that we do know these problems are there and he has been trying to work with the residents. These letters were sent out June 17th. Denny sent these out certified mail. Denny was instructed to research these complaints. A motion was made that after the letter goes out, if no response we can go have the work done and bill the owners back was made by Councilman Myers.
