AN ORDINANCE

Prohibiting the running at large of Dogs in the Borough of Yoe, York County, Pennsylvania, providing penalties for the violation thereof, and directing Police Officers to kill Dogs running at large.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Council of the Borough of Yoe, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same,

SECTION I. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog to permit the dog to run at large, either upon the public streets or alleys of the Borough, or upon property of any one other than the owner of the dog.

SECTION II. It shall be the duty of the Borough Police Officers to kill any dog found running at large upon the public streets or alleys, of the Borough, or upon property not belonging to the owner of the dog, and unaccompanied by the owner or keeper.

SECTION III. Any person who is the owner of a dog and violates the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable upon conviction thereof in a summary proceeding before the Chief Burgess or a Justice of the Peace of the Borough of Yoe, to a fine of not more than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars for each and every offense, and in default of the payment thereof shall undergo imprisonment for not more than five (5) days.
