ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 84-002 RELATING TO
SEWERS AND SEWAGE DISCHARGE.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, it is hereby enacted and ordained by the
Yoe Borough Council as follows:

SECTION I

All references to "24 hour composite" contained in Ordinance 84-002
are hereby amended to read "daily composite sample".

SECTION II

Ordinance No. 84-002, Section 3, Subsection d, shall hereafter read as
follows:

Sampling. The sampling procedure for the determination
of the discharge of unacceptable sanitary sewage or
industrial wastes specified in subsection (c) shall be
as follows: Oil and grease, free chlorine temperature,
and pH [subsection (c) (4), (5), and (6)] shall be by
grab sample only. The substances referred to in sub-
section (c) (10) shall be by a daily composite sample
or a grab sample, subject to the concentrations stated
for each type of sample. All others shall be by a daily
composite sample. Samples shall be taken at the manhole
or metering chamber referred to in Section 18-19 (d) of
this Article, or in the absence of such manhole or
metering chamber, at such place as the Borough shall
determine will provide a representative sample of the
discharge, or at any other place mutually agreed upon by
the Borough and the discharger of the sanitary sewage
or industrial wastes.

SECTION III

Ordinance 84-002, Section e, Subsection f, is repealed and replaced by the following 2 Sections:

Federal Requirements. Upon the promulgation of any Federal Standards or requirements (including, but not limited to, Federal Categorical Pretreatment Standards for particular industrial sub-category), the Federal Standards or requirements shall immediately supercede the limitations imposed under this Ordinance if the Federal Standards are more stringent than the limitations imposed under this Ordinance.

State Requirements. State requirements and limitations on discharges shall apply in any case where they are more stringent than federal requirements and limitations, or the requirements and limitations set forth in this Ordinance.

SECTION IV

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage.
