Whereas, Blue Star Service Banners were created in 1917 and were commonly used and seen during WWI and WWII.

Whereas, the use of Blue Star Banners were resurrected by the American legion in 2001.

Whereas, the banner is to be displayed prominently in a front window, to show that a family member is currently serving in the Armed Forces. Each blue star representing one family member serving. A gold star replacing the blue star to indicate that a family member has died while serving.

Whereas, the Yoe Borough Council would like to show support to the servicemen and women of the Armed Forces, as well as their families, by recognizing the sacrifices of these men and women, to protect our freedoms, not only to our Borough but the Nation as a whole.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the Borough of Yoe hereby adopts the Blue Star Service Banner Program. ***Whereby***, The Borough Council shall provide, free of charge, to all families residing in the Borough with a family member (s) serving in the Armed Forces of The United States of America, or Reserves, a Blue Star Service Banner with the proper number of stars attached, upon that family registering the name and affiliation of the serving family member (s) with the Borough Secretary.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the names of those service members be displayed at the Yoe Borough Offices as a constant reminder of the selfless sacrifices of the sons and daughters of Yoe Borough.
