RESOLUTION NO. 2021 – 31

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF TROY, ILLINOIS APPROVING STREET CLOSURES FOR THE MEMORIAL DAY PARADE

WHEREAS, the Troy American Legion Post #708 is sponsoring a Memorial Day Parade in the City of Troy, Illinois, which event constitutes a public purpose; and

WHEREAS, this Parade will require the temporary closure of Market Street, a State highway in the City of Troy from Hickory Street to Wickliffe Street and will end at the Tri-Township Park; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-408 of the Illinois Highway Code authorizes the Department of Transportation to issue permits to local authorities to temporarily close portions of State Highways for such public purposes.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Troy that permission to close off Market Street from Hickory Street to Wickliffe Street for purposes of a Memorial Day Parade concluding in the Tri Township Park as above designated, be requested of the Department of Transportation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this closure shall occur during the approximate time period between 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, May 29, 2022; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that traffic from that closed portion of highway shall be detoured over routes with an all-weather surface that can accept the anticipated traffic, which will be maintained to the satisfaction of the Department and which is conspicuously marked for the benefit of traffic diverted from the State highway; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Troy assumes full responsibility for the direction, protection, and regulation of the traffic while the detour is in effect; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that police officers or authorized flaggers shall, at the expense of the City of Troy, be positioned at each end of the closed section, and at other points (such as intersections) as may be necessary to assist in directing traffic through the detour; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that police officers, flaggers and officials shall permit emergency vehicles in emergency situations to pass through the closed areas as swiftly as is safe for all concerned; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all debris shall be removed by the City of Troy prior to the reopening of the State highway; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such signs, flags, and barricades, etc., shall be used by the City of Troy as may be approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation, and that these items shall be provided by the City of Troy, Illinois; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the closure and detour shall be marked according to the Illinois Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an occasional break shall be made in the procession so that traffic may pass through. In any event, adequate provisions will be made for traffic on intersecting highways pursuant to conditions noted above; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to the fullest extent permitted by law, the American Legion Post #708 shall be responsible for any and all injuries to persons or damage to property, and shall indemnify and hold harmless the Illinois Department of Transportation, its officers, employees and agents from any and all claims, lawsuits, actions, costs and fees (including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses) of every nature or description, arising out of, resulting from or connected with exercise of authority granted by the Department which is subject of this resolution. The obligation is binding upon the America Legion Post #708 regardless of whether or not such claim, damage, loss or expense is caused in part by the act, omission or negligence of the Department or its officers, employees or agents; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the <u>American Legion Post #708</u> shall provide a comprehensive general liability insurance policy or an additional named insured endorsement in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 per person and \$2,000,000.00 aggregate which has the Illinois Department of Transportation and its officials, employees and agents as insured and which protects them from all claims arising from the requested road closing. A copy of said policy or endorsement will be provided to the Department before the road is closed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Department of Transportation, District 8 to serve as a formal request for the permission sought in this resolution and to operate as part of the conditions as said permission.
