AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 42. HEALTH AND SANITATION. ARTICLE III. PUBLIC HEALTH NUISANCES. SECTION 42.61. TATTOOING PROHIBITED OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF MARSHALL, ILLINOIS.

Section 1. That Chapter 42. Health and Sanitation. Article III. Public Health Nuisances. Section 42.61. Tattooing Prohibited of the Code of Ordinances, City of Marshall, Illinois is hereby amended to read as follows, with strikeouts indicating deletions in text and underscores indicating additions to text:

Sec. 42-61. ~~Tattooing prohibited.~~

~~It shall be unlawful for any person to tattoo or offer to tattoo any person. As used herein "tattoo" means to insert pigment under the surface of the skin of a human being, by pricking with a needle or otherwise, so as to produce a permanent indelible mark or figure visible on the skin. The provisions of this section shall not apply to physicians, osteopaths or dentists operating for medical purposes in the course of his or her practice.~~

As used herein, "tattoo" means to insert pigment under the surface of the skin of a human being, by pricking with a needle or otherwise to produce a permanent indelible mark or figure visible on the skin.

Tattooing is permissible by physicians, osteopaths or dentists operating for medical purposes during his or her practice or by a tattoo artist licensed by the State of Illinois and inspected by the Clark County Health Department.

Section 2. If any provision of this Ordinance, or application thereof, is held invalid by any Court, other provisions or applications of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application shall not be affected, and to this end the provisions of this

Ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after its passage and approval as provided by law.


