Ordinance No. 2024 - 06

An Ordinance of the City of Troy, Illinois, Amending Title II, Chapter 35 (Police), Section 35.035 (Chief of Police) within the Codified Ordinances

ADOPTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL

OF THE CITY OF TROY, ILLINOIS

Published in pamphlet form by the authority of the City Council of the City of Troy, Madison County, Illinois, this 5th day of February, 2024.

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities of the City of Troy adopted a Code of Ordinances and have made revisions and additions thereto; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities adopted Title II, Chapter 35 Police; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities deem it to be in the best interests of the City to amend section 35.035 Chief of Police within the Codified Ordinances, which established the position of Chief of Police.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Troy, Madison County, Illinois as follows:

<u>Section 1: Recitals.</u> The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

Section 2: Amendment.

The Codified Ordinances of the City of Troy, Title II, Chapter 35 (Police), Sections 35.035 (Chief of Police) is hereby amended as follows:

CHIEF OF POLICE

§ 35.035 OFFICE OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE CREATED.

- (A) There is hereby established the office of the Chief of Police, who shall be appointed by the Mayor, by and with the consent of the City Council.
- (B) The Chief of Police must possess a bachelor's degree from an accredited four (4) year college or university and have at least five years of full-time service as a police officer.
- (C) The compensation for the office of the Chief of Police shall be established from time to time by the Mayor and City Council.
- Section 3: Severability. If any provisions of this Ordinance, or the application of any provisions of this Ordinance, is held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such occurrence shall not affect other provisions of this Ordinance, or their application, that can be given effect without the unconstitutional or invalid provision or its application. Each unconstitutional or invalid provision or application of such provision, is severable, unless otherwise provided by this Ordinance.
- <u>Section 4: Effective date.</u> This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and publication as provided by law.
- <u>Section 5</u>: All ordinances or parts of ordinances thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict.

<u>Section 6</u>: Any section or provision of this Ordinance that is construed to be invalid or void shall not affect the remaining sections or provisions which shall remain in full force and effect thereafter.
